12 Connecting the Sky and the Town Mt. Senkoji Ropeway

The Mt. Senkoji Ropeway connects the Onomichi city center to Senkoji Park. Operating every 15 minutes from 9:00 to 17:15, the scenic ride reaches the summit in about 3 minutes. Enjoy an "aerial stroll" with Japan Heritage sites unfolding beneath you.

5 Onomichi Club

10 Kobo Onomichi Hanpu

11 Neko No Hosomichi (Cat Alley)

A narrow hillside path tucked behind Ushitora Shrine, a stone's throw from Mt. Senkoji Ropeway Station. As you wander along this path toward the mountain, you'll discover charming cat-themed art at every turn. It's a quiet, heartwarming detour loved by cat enthusiasts and travelers alike.



13 Kissa-bu Akubi (Located inside Anago-no-nedoko)

Drawing inspiration from "travel" and "school days," this charming cafe occupies a repurposed eyewear store. The nostalgic interior, featuring well-loved blackboards and retro silverware, recreates the delightful atmosphere of a Japanese school lunch. It's the perfect spot to slow down and enjoy old-fashioned treats in a cozy, timeless setting.

2 Oyatsu to Yamaneko Main Store

16 Onomichi City Hall Rooftop Observation Deck
