



SETODA



Kosanji Temple Museum(Miraishin no Oka)

The Choseizan Kosanji is a temple which belongs to the Honganji School of the Jodo-Shinshu Sect of Buddhism. It was built by Priest Kosanji Kozo, who entered the priesthood after his mother's death to pray for the repose of her soul. The construction of the numerous halls and towers started in 1936 and took more than 30 years to finish. The buildings adopt typical styles and techniques of Buddhist architectures from Asuka, Nara, Kamakura, and Edo periods. Upon entering the main gate built in the same style as that of the Shishinden Hall of the Kyoto Imperial Palace, you will see an inner gate reminiscent of a two-story gate at Horyuji Temple in Nara, a pathway then leads to the Rakando Hall with the 500 Rakan Buddhist statues placed inside and to the prayer hall which fully represents the architectural beauty of Momoyama period.



Spreading on a small hill in the precincts of Kosanji Temple Museum is an environmental design site called Miraishin no Oka (Hill of Hope), which was created with marble by internationally famous sculptor Itto Kuetani. The harmony of the white Italian marble and the blue of the Seto Inland Sea will gently comfort the visitors.

Kojoji Temple Three-Story Pagoda (National Treasure)



This vermilion lacquered three-story pagoda stands on Mt. Cho'onzan overlooking Setoda Port. Kojoji Temple itself was built in 1403, while the three-story pagoda was built in 1432, both in the Muromachi period. Amazing carving on the wooden eaves and jointed beams make this a piece of spectacular architecture. It also employs various unusual techniques, including the inverted lotus-flower decorations on the main pillars of the four corners of each story.

Hirayama Ikuo Museum of Art

Japanese-style painter Ikuo Hirayama was born in an old-established family in Setoda-cho in 1930. As he grew up looking at the islands of the Seto Inland Sea, surrounded by numerous old temples and lush nature, he became one of the most renowned painters in Japan. This museum thoroughly introduces his great achievements. Besides the recent works, it also exhibits documents created by Hirayama, such as paintings from his youth, sketches and drafts, as well as video images featuring his art.


Citrus Park Setoda



Once you pass through the entrance gate, you will be greeted with a magnificent view of the blue sea, sky, and islands of the Seto Inland sea. There are 1,300 lemon trees in the park and a glamping facility where you can easily enjoy a private space in the great outdoors, making it a place that everyone from children to adults can enjoy.

Mt. Kannon



Setodacho National Park Kannyonama is 472 meters above sea level. The highest peak of the Geiyo Islands and the islanders call it Mt. Fire Taki. It is said that it got its name long ago from the fact that it raised a "noroshi", or smoke signal, as a means of communication for ship traffic. The scenery from the top of the mountain is the best in the Seto Inland Sea, and you can see the Shikoku peaks and the Chugoku Mountains. A large panorama of the Geiyo Islands spreads out before you.

A seaside park located in the center of the Setouchi Shimanami Kaido that makes the most of the nature of the west coast of Ikuchi Island.

The 800m long white sandy beach is shallow and the waves are gentle. It has been certified as one of Japan's best beaches. And, as the name suggests, a beautiful sunset soothes your soul. You can enjoy not only swimming in the sea, but also marine activities such as kayaking and SUP. There are also other activities such as camping and cycling that can be enjoyed throughout the year.





Exit/entry is available in one direction at:

- **Ikuchijima-Minami Exit/Entrance**
• Exit only from Imabari (Shikoku) area

• Entry only for Imabari (Shikoku) region visitors
• No entry for Onomichi (Honshu) region visitors
- **Ikuchijima-Kita Exit/Entrance**
