Innoshima Suigun Castle



This is a museum which displays many historical artifacts, such as weapons, armor, ancient documents left by the Murakami Suigun. Murakami Suigun was a navy or a group of pirates and they were active in the Nanbokucho, the Muromachi and the Sengoku periods.

- Hours** 09:30 - 17:00 (Last entry 16:30)
(Second and third of January, between 10am and 3pm)
- Closed days** Thursdays (except on holidays)
Year-end and New Year season
- Admission** Adults 330yen (220 yen for a group of 30 and more)
Elementary/Junior high students 160yen
(110 yen for a group of 30 and more)
- Access** A 10 min. walk after a 7 min. ride on an Innoshima Ohashi bus from Kanamebashi stop to Suigunjo-Iriguchi stop

Konrenji Temple



Konrenji Temple was the family temple of the Murakami Suigun pirates. It is said to have been built by Murakami Bitchu no Kami Yoshisuke, the castellan of Aokage Castle. There are 18 sacred stone towers and numerous Five-Element Pagodas in the back, reminiscent of the dream of the spartan pirates.

- Access** A 15 min. walk after a 7 min. ride on an Innoshima Ohashi bus from Kanamebashi stop to Suigunjo-Iriguchi stop

Innoshima Flower Center

Flower beds and spaces with grass in Innoshima Flower Center are open to anyone free of charge. In addition, many events are held.

Innoshima Amenity Park / Shimanami Beach



A white-sand beach, stretching about 600 meters, offers a beautiful sunset view. In summer, it attracts many people as the venue of the Suigun Festival. There is a water slide and a swimming pool for infants at the Amenity Pool next to the beach.

- Access** A 10 min. walk from Innoshima Ohashi bus stop

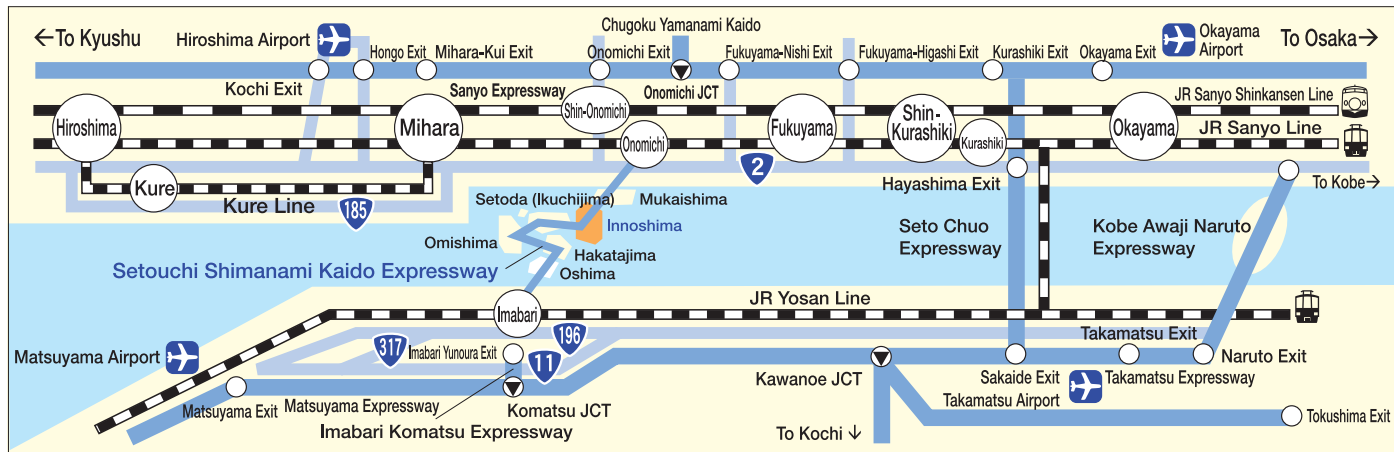
Hon'inbo Shusaku Igo Memorial Hall



The house where Go master of the Edo period Honinbo Shusaku was born has restored to preserve and display the artifacts relating to the genius.

Statues of Five Hundred Buddha's Disciples on Mt. Shirataki

On 227-meter-high Mt. Shirataki, Yoshimitsu Murakami built the Kannondo Temple complete with Gohyaku Rakan, or stone statues of 500 disciples of Buddha. About 700 statues of different sizes, carved by Denroku Kashiwara and his disciples, stand closely together on the summit. The mountain top provides a panoramic view of the island-studded Seto Inland Sea spreading out below. Impressed by this view, Poet Isamu Yoshii, wrote this poem: "Climbing up the mountain of Shirataki, a great view spreads out, islands on the sea, the sea with islands." The view of Mt. Shirataki and pyrethrum fields has been chosen as one of the best 100 rural sceneries in Japan.



- Access** About 40 min. walk from the Flower Center bus stop

Innoshima Park

Designated as a special area of the national park, the Innoshima Park offers a splendid view which represents the scenic beauty of the Seto Inland Sea. Along with about 800 cherry trees, there are many things to see, such as Suigun pirates memorials, a stone monument of Fumiko Hayashi's literary work, 5-meter-high Sabataishi statue and Tureshio no Ishibumi stone-paved trail (Path of Literature).



- Access** A 5 min. by taxi or a 15 min. walk from Habu Port.

Ohamasaki Todai Memorial Hall



This memorial hall was built during the Meiji period and is the only wooden ship traffic signal station still standing in Japan. It was designated as a national important cultural property in 2024.

- Access** A 10 min. walk from Innoshima Ohashi bus stop

Jizobana Guardian Statue



A stone image of Jizo, a guardian deity, was carved on a rock to pray for the spirit of a woman captured by the Murakami pirates. Now it is believed by the locals as Jizo which answers the prayers of women.

- Access** A 20min. Walk after 8min. Get off Hama Ue. ride on a Westbound for Sansho.

Aokage / Okuyama Hiking Course



A 4-km hiking trail stretches across the island from east to west, connecting Mt. Okuyama, the highest mountain in the island, and Mt. Aokage where the medieval castle of Murakami Suigun pirates remains.

- Access** Get off at Kanayama bus stop, walk 30 min. to a starting point of the trail on Mt. Aokage

Why not stop off for a while to enjoy the charm of Innoshima?



The white flowers of pyrethrum, which used to be cultivated as the raw material of pesticide, covered the entire island in May, signaling the change of season. Now they are cultivated in Four areas (of approx. 4,900 m²) in order for local residents to enjoy the view. The flowers are at their best in early May.

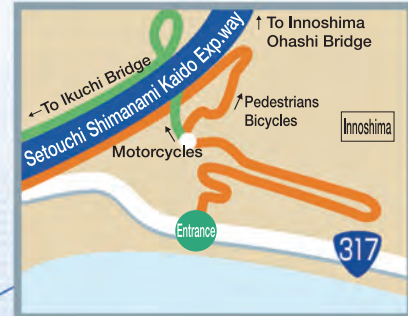
